We all know February is the month of love . . . Valentine's Day AND the beginning of Lent. This year Lent begins on February 18 – just a few days after Valentine's Day. Actually that is so appropriate!! Who is this Valentine guy anyway? What does it have to do with the Lord? Glad you asked!

There are many traditions and stories associated with St. Valentine – all say he was a priest who was arrested for preaching the Gospel. Tradition holds he was brought to the home of a Roman judge whom he tried to convince of the validity of the Gospel. The home was full of pagan idols. The judge had a blind daughter. The judge told Valentinus (Valentine) if he could heal his daughter, he would believe in Jesus. Valentine did heal the girl, the judge removed all the idols and was baptized. Later Valentine tried to convert the emperor who refused and had him imprisoned and sentenced to death. It is said one of his last acts was to write the judge's daughter a letter and he signed it 'your valentine.' The love of Valentine was first and foremost about his love for the Lord. His love of God and love of others (by sharing the Good News) was the focus of everything he did. It was a sign of ultimate love – being willing to die because of his love – that "your valentine" represents.

Lent is the 40-day period leading up to Easter (April 5) where we are to examine our hearts and our priorities so that our lives will reflect our love for God and our neighbor. Our Ash Wednesday services will be Wednesday February 18 at 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 pm (Noon) in the Sanctuary. Remember – you are known, you are seen, you are understood, you are loved. "May you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep His love is." (Ephesians 3:18)
